GETTING STARTED Candidate Information

CITY OF SANTA MONICA GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

The following information is intended to assist residents who are considering running for the office of the City Council, the Rent Control Board, the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District or the Santa Monica College District in the City of Santa Monica's General Municipal Election.

This information is intended to provide general guidance only. While the information contained herein is believed to be substantially correct, it is not intended to provide legal or factual advice.

General qualifications to run for and hold public office:

A candidate **must be**:

- U.S. citizen;
- 18 years old on or before election day; and
- Registered voter living in the jurisdiction at the time nomination papers are issued.

A candidate **may not** be in prison or on parole for a felony conviction.

Election Dates

The City of Santa Monica conducts elections every two years to elect members of the City Council, Rent Control Board, Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District and Santa Monica College District. These elections are held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of even-numbered years. The next general election will be held on November 4, 2014.

Getting started early...

One reason to start early is to begin collecting contributions for the election campaign. In order to do this, or if you plan to raise or spend \$1,000 or more during your campaign, you must establish your candidate committee.

What you need to do:

- Review [Campaign Disclosure Manual 2](#) Information for Local Candidates and their primarily formed committees.
- File [Form 501 Candidate Intention Statement](#) before receiving contributions or spending own funds.
- Set up a bank account for your committee
- File [Form 410 Statement of Organization](#) within 10 days of receiving \$1000 in contributions, or earlier.

- File appropriate campaign statement as required by filing deadlines: Either Form 460 (Recipient Committee Campaign Statement) or Form 470 (Officeholder/Candidate Campaign Statement-Short Form).

You may file electronically at www.netfile.com/filer. Forms may also be obtained from the State of California Fair Political Practices Commission's website at www.fppc.ca.gov (click on "Campaign", then "Forms/Manuals") or from the City Clerk's Office.

Local Contribution Limit...

Please note that the City of Santa Monica has a local contribution limit of \$325 for City Council and Rent Control Board candidates. Santa Monica Municipal Code Section 11.04.050(a) states: "No person shall make to any candidate for office or to the controlled committee of such a candidate a contribution or contributions totaling more than three hundred twenty five dollars for each election in which the candidate was on is on or is likely to be on the ballot or in which the candidate sought or seeks write-in votes." **This contribution limit does not apply to School Board and College Board candidates.**

Candidate nomination period...

The candidate filing period runs for four weeks during mid- July and the first part of August of even numbered years. For the November 4, 2014, General Municipal Election, the filing period is from July 14th through August 8th at 5:00 p.m. **There is now a \$25 filing fee to run for office.** Candidates must be registered voters in the City of Santa Monica at the time nomination papers are issued.



The City Clerk's Office will hold candidate workshops on the first day of the filing period to go over the process and the required forms in detail. Nomination papers will be issued to any qualified voter at the workshop, and will be issued through the end of the filing period upon request. In order to qualify, a candidate must obtain the signatures of at least 100 registered voters in the City of Santa Monica on the nomination papers.

After the nomination period closes...

CAMPAIGN DISCLOSURE STATEMENTS

Candidates will be required to file periodic campaign disclosure statements during the course of the election. Campaign disclosure statements document contributions received and expenditures made by the candidate and his/her committee during the course of running for election. The City Clerk will publish due dates, filing periods, and forms to be filed. See "Getting Started Early" in the previous page.

ECONOMIC INTEREST STATEMENTS (FORM 700)

Candidates running for City Council and Rent Control Board are required to file with the City Clerk a Statement of Economic Interests disclosing investments, interests in real property and income when they file nomination papers. Officeholders are required to file this form annually until the end of their term. **School Board and College Board candidates are not required to file this form when they file nomination papers.**

RECORD KEEPING

During the course of the campaign, candidates and their campaign committee should keep all receipts for expenditures, detailed records of mass mailings, and detailed information about the source of contributions. Records must be retained for four years after the election.



IMPORTANT THINGS TO REMEMBER:

- **BEFORE RAISING OR SPENDING ANY MONEY**

File Form 501 (Candidate Intention). Then open a campaign bank account. Once \$1,000 is raised or spent, get an identification number by filing Form 410.

- **\$325 LOCAL CONTRIBUTION LIMIT**

If you are a Council or Rent Control Board candidate, do not accept contributions totaling more than \$325 from any one contributor or entities controlled by the contributor.

- **BE INFORMED**

TAXPAYER PROTECTION AMENDMENT OF 2000

The People of Santa Monica approved a Charter Amendment (also known as "The Oaks Initiative") at the November 7, 2000, election. If you are elected to the City Council or the Rent Control Board, as a result of this Charter Amendment, you may be prohibited in the future from accepting contributions from persons or entities receiving public benefits as a result of your affirmative vote as a City Councilmember. The Santa Monica City Charter Article XXII may be viewed at the following website: gcode.us/codes/santamonica (click on "The Charter of the City of Santa Monica, then "Article XXII-Taxpayer Protection"). **Please note that this law is not applicable to School and College Board officeholders.**
